Steagall law, in the late 1990s until then U.S. Treasury Secretary Robert Rubin engineered the law's repeal. Rubin later became the chairman of the executive committee of Citigroup, helping to oversee the bank as it ramped up its increasing mortgage risks before the 2008 crash. The scale of the financial panic of 2008 was not, as the media and experts claim, unprecedented. As *Borrowed Time* shows, disasters have been relatively frequent during the century of government-protected banking—especially at Citi.
